The newest technology...

The newest technology in laser therapies involves a fractional approach coupled with the 2940nm wavelength erbium laser. This new approach to laser resurfacing creates micro-ablation channels in the skin instantly removing micro columns of unwanted damaged tissue, resulting in a deep thermal response. This thermal response stimulates new collagen production during the healing process to reduce the signs wrinkles, scars, and textural irregularities. This new technology differs from past techniques of aggressive ablation with carbon dioxide and erbium lasers of the entire skin surface leading to greater down time, wounds, and potential complications.

What you can expect...

A topical numbing agent is applied to alleviate any discomfort you may experience during the procedure. The actual procedure takes less than 30 minutes, with patients able to drive themselves to and from the appointments. After the procedure you will look red like you've spent many hours at the beach without sunscreen, with only a thin coat of a Vaseline type product needed throughout the next couple of days to assist the healing process. Some swelling and minor pin point bleeding may occur immediately after which improves after a few days. You can start to reapply your cosmetics after just a couple of days.
